The Arnold & Porter 1L Los Angeles Diversity and Inclusion Fellowship supports the firm's deep commitment to diversity and inclusion and is designed to increase diversity and inclusion within our firm and the legal profession. The 1L Los Angeles Diversity and Inclusion Fellow will be awarded:

- A 10-week paid summer associate position in the Los Angeles office
- A \$10,000 scholarship to be used for 2L year
- A \$5,000 award to be used for 3L year, provided the student has received and accepted an offer to join the Summer Associate program for a minimum of 8 weeks during their 2L summer

Criteria

Qualified applicants are currently enrolled, first-year law students at ABA-accredited law schools in California who:

- Are members of a historically underrepresented group in the legal profession, including law students who are members of racial and/or ethnic minority groups, are differently abled, or are from disadvantaged socioeconomic backgrounds
- Demonstrate strong academic achievement
- Demonstrate an interest in promoting diversity and inclusion in the legal profession
- Demonstrate leadership qualities within the law school and community
- Are authorized to work in the U.S.

Procedure

Applicants must submit a current resume, official law school transcript*, and a personal statement (limited to 500 words) that describes the importance of diversity and inclusion in their personal background and how they have demonstrated a commitment to promoting diversity and inclusion in the legal profession. *If your law school has not released first semester grades by the application deadline, you may submit your application without your law school transcript. We will follow up to request an updated transcript, if needed.
