Most significantly, on January 22, 2009, California's Department of Toxic Substances Control (DTSC) issued a "call-in" letter to numerous users and manufacturers of carbon nanotubes (CNT) who are doing business in California. Coupled with EPA's changed stance in requiring Toxic Substances Control Act (TSCA) information submittals for key nano products (including carbon nanotubes), these are among the first significant regulatory steps to address this area. These actions will set key precedents for further products. They may possibly create industry or regulatory standards important in any future nano product litigation.
